## About the Commission:

The Government of Odisha has set up the Odisha State Commission for Women, a statutory body under the Odisha State Commission for Women Act, 1993 (Odisha Act 19 of 1994) for protection and promotion of rights and entitlements of women and to deal with atrocities, offences and gender-based violence against them in the State. The basic objective for which the Commission has been set up is to ensure a women friendly society where the dignity and safety of women in every sphere of life is well protected and women can enjoy their life with dignity and without fear or despair.

The Odisha State Commission for Women also aims at rendering support to the Government in formulating policies and implementing laws to improve the socio-economic status of women and to create awareness on their rights to live a life with safety and security as a productive member of the society

## Composition of the Commission:

As per the Orissa State Commission for Women Act 1993(Orissa Act 19 of 1994), the Commission comprises of:

1. A Chairperson, who is an eminent social worker or a professional, committed to the cause of women to be nominated by the State Government;
2. Six Members to be nominated by the State Government from amongst persons of ability, integrity and standing of whom:
  - (a) One shall be an Official Member,
  - (b) One shall be an eminent Advocate,
  - (c) two shall be Social Workers of repute, and
  - (d) two shall be experts in education and health,

Provided that at least one Member shall be from amongst persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and the Scheduled Tribes (STs) respectively.

The composition of the Commission as on 31.03.2024 is as follows:

1. Chairperson – Dr. Minati Behera, and
2. Other Four Members - a member post is lying vacant

A Government Officer serves as Official Member of the Commission. The Convenor Secretary of the Commission has been appointed from the Odisha Administrative Service (OAS) cadre and in the rank of Additional Secretary to Government of Odisha.

### Objectives of the Commission:

- The objectives of the Odisha State Commission for Women are to protect and promote the rights and entitlements of women in the state.
- To create an enabling environment in the state to ensure gender equality by preventing gender-based violence and to advocate for women friendly society and to focus on upholding the rights, dignity, safety and security of women to live a life with dignity.
- To redress the grievances of aggrieved women from across the state in case of violation of their rights.
- Rendering support to the Government in formulating policies and implementing laws to improve the socio-economic status of each and every woman across the state.
- To recommend to the state Government on the basis of specific reports on improving the status of women in the state.

### Functions of the Commission:

- Conduct in-depth studies on the economic, educational and health situation of the women with emphasis on tribal districts and areas of the state.
- Speedy redressal of grievances and peaceful resolution of complaints of women through the process of counselling, conciliation and mediation.
- Organising district level grievances redressal camps and legal awareness programmes to reach out to women living in remote areas of the state.
- Compile information on offences against women relating to marriage, dowry, rape, kidnaping, criminal abduction, eve-teasing, immoral trafficking and in the cases of medical negligence in causing delivery or sterilization or medical intervene relates to child bearing or child birth.
- Receive complaints on atrocities on women, offences against women, deprivation of women of their rights, minimum wages, violation of health and maternity rights of women and atrocities on women in custody.
- Inspect or cause to be inspected a jail, remand home, women's institution or other place of custody to ensure safety of women.
- Organise capacity building training programme for all stakeholders involved in improving the status of women.

- Promotion of advocacy for policy level changes.
- Training and orientation programme for organisations and institutions providing services to women.
- Organise internship training programme for law students on women and law.

### **Investigation of cases as a Civil Court U/s 10 (3) of the State Commission for Women Act, 1993**

- Summoning and enforcing the attendance of any person from any part of India and examining him on oath;
- Requiring the discovery and production of any document;
- Receiving evidence on affidavits;
- Requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office;
- Issuing commissions for the examination of witness and documents and any other matter which may be prescribed.

## Activities of Different Cells of the Commission

### **Legal Cell:**

The Legal Cell consists of 02 (two) Legal Assistants and 9 dealing Assistants. After receipt of petitions from the Diary Section, the dealing Assistants prepare a brief of the case and put up the file with complaints received from the petitioner/opposite party/SP/LSA/Collector/OIC and other officers to the Legal Assistants for their suggestions. The Legal Assistants examine the file with reference to the petition/complaint received and to provide suitable suggestions and enclose the file to Chairperson/Convenor Secretary for their perusal and orders. Then the dealing Assistants carry out the orders passed by the Chairperson/ Convenor Secretary. Legal Cell also issues summons to persons/parties to appear before the Commission as per requirement.

Besides, dealing with petitions/complaints of the aggrieved parties, this Cell also organizes Grievance Redressal Camps (Lok Adalats and Janasunaris) at the district/ block level, takes care of assembly questions and conducts Board Meetings as and when required.

### **Investigation Cell:**

The Investigation Cell conducts inquiries/investigations in case of serious crimes or atrocities against women, visits spot, examines witnesses, collects evidence and submits report to the Commission with recommendations. The implementation of the recommendations of the inquiry team is being monitored by the Commission. The Investigation Cell deals with such disputes which are not resolved through counselling sessions. These types of cases require further investigation by the Police which are expedited and monitored by the Investigation cell. A duly constituted Inquiry Committee also visits the spot and conducts enquires on the serious crimes. While conducting inquiry, witnesses are being examined, evidence on the incident are collected and thereafter the Committee submits its reports with recommendations for actions. Such investigation provides immediate relief to the victims of violence and atrocities.

During the year 2023-24, the cell has investigated and submitted reports on 3 nos. of cases

### **Counselling Cell:**

The Counselling Cell primarily provides counselling service to parties in marital dispute/ family dispute cases and through the process of regular counselling, conciliation and mediation, the Commission resolves most of the disputes and help reunite the families/settle disputes.

The Counselling Cell comprises of 03 (three) Counsellors of which one post is lying vacant which constitutes an important segment of the Commission. It provides counselling services on different aspects of life of women and support women how to manage stressful situations. Many petitioners approach the Commission for counselling services/advice even before submitting their complaints. In fact, most of the complaints are resolved through counselling and conciliation process. The pre-marital counselling and post-marital counselling immensely help women in distress offering appropriate solutions to their problems/mis-understanding.

During the year 2023-24, the Counselling Cell has provided counselling services in 1,227 nos. of cases/disputes out of which, a total of 182 nos. of cases/disputes have been resolved.

### **Research Cell:**

The Research Cell compiles month and year wise data on case registration and disposals, data on category-wise cases registered and disposed of, district wise data on atrocities and crimes against women like dowry death, dowry torture, domestic violence, rape, sexual harassment, workplace harassment and other cases. At the end of the year, the Cell compiles the data month-wise and category-wise. Besides, the Research Cell also deals with RTI applications and conducts

research studies on issues relating to women.

The Research Cell is managed by a Research Assistant who registers all the cases received by the Commission from the complainants and prepares district-wise data on daily basis. Besides, the above, the Cell provides data/information for press and assembly questions, deals with National Commission for Women (NCW) & files of State Commission for Women (SCW) and RTI matters of the Commission.

### Library, Publications and IEC Materials:

Publication wing of the Commission has been constantly trying to bring out new publications and information brochures for dissemination of information to public for enriching public knowledge on issues relating to women. During 2023-24, the Commission has published books on 'Hasa Phutila Paribar Tisthila' and FAQ Law Books (one book contains 132 pages and another book contains 60 pages) to create legal awareness. Besides, Annual Report for the year 2023-24 has also been prepared and published.

### Free Legal Aid Clinic:

The Commission has set up a Free Legal Aid Clinic in the office premises of the Commission on 19.12.2022 with the financial support from National Commission for Women (NCW), New Delhi. The aim of the Legal Aid Clinic is to facilitate legal aid service/support to victims of domestic violence, crimes against women or destitute women who are in need of the same. The free legal aid clinic of the Commission refers cases of parties to the appropriate legal services authorities like Taluk Level Legal Services Authority, District Level Legal Services Authority and State Level Legal Service Authorities to provide legal aid support.

During the year 2023-24, the Free Legal Aid Clinic has referred to different legal services authorities, Superintendent of Police, DSP/IIC and other authorities for facilitating free legal aid services to poor women in 1,176 nos. of cases covering across all districts of Odisha.

### Accounts Cell:

The Accounts Cell keeps and maintains the detail statement of accounts of the office of the Commission. This cell comprises of an Accountant-cum-Storekeeper and a Typist. The cell deals with the activities of office establishment, stock and store charges and maintenance of bills, vouchers and records for audit compliances. It also calculates the honorarium and T.A. & D.A. of Chairperson and Members and draw the salary and remuneration of other staff members. The cell maintains the Cash Book and Ledger and keeps the day-to-day accounts of the office of the Commission up to date.

## District Level Camp Courts:

The Commission conducts district level Camp Courts on regular basis in collaboration with district administration to resolve disputes at the door step of the complainants in a short span of time to provide relief as an alternative grievance redressal mechanism. It also helps parties to resolve dispute at their locality without incurring extra expenditure in travelling for the same. During the year 2023-24, the Commission has conducted the following Camp Courts:

Legal Awareness Programmes are conducted at district level to create awareness among women and public regarding their rights and entitlements. 
At the end of the legal awareness programme, 10 Nos. of Covid-19 warriors were felicitated by the Commission for providing best services to the public during Covid-19 period.

## Visit to Mahila O Sishu Desks:

Odisha State Commission for Women regularly visits Mahila O Sishu Desk set ups functioning in police stations. With an aim to facilitate integrated approach towards prevention of crimes against women & children, the police administration of the state has set up Mahila O Sishu Desks as special policing system in different Police Stations of the State. The Commission regularly pay visit to such Mahila O Sishu Desks to ensure functioning of the said set ups for women and children. ## Capacity Building & Training Programmes for ICC Members:

As a part of the training and capacity building programme of Odisha State Commission for Women (OSCW), the Commission has organized a capacity building training and awareness programme for Members of Internal Complaint Committees (ICCs) for prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace in industrial sector.

During the year, 2023-24, Odisha State Commission for Women with the support from National Commission for Women (NCW), New Delhi organized a capacity building training and awareness programme on 11.07.2023 in the Conference Hall of OUAT, Bhubaneswar, for 100 Nos. of Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) Members from different industrial sectors. The objective of the training programme was to impart orientation training to the ICC Members on formation, function and how to redress the grievances of aggrieved women working in the industrial sectors



and how to prevent and prohibit sexual harassment at workplace in industrial sector. The training programme was organized by the Commission in collaboration with FICCI Ladies Organization (FLO), Bhubaneswar. At the outset of the training and capacity building programme, Dr. Minati Behera, Chairperson, OSCW inaugurated the training programme by joining as Chief Guest and delivered the keynote address. During her interaction with participants, she stated that all the women employees of industrial sector should be protected from sexual harassment at workplace and all office of the industries in Odisha should form Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) at workplace for redressal of grievances of women employees. She requested all the employees of industrial sectors to file complaints in the respective ICC in case face harassment at workplace.

Among others, Smt. Punam Mohapatra, Chairperson, FLO, Bhubaneswar, along with other Members of FICCI Ladies Organization were also present. During interaction with participants, Smt. Punam Mohapatra stated that establishments under FICCI should ensure constitution of Internal Complaint Committees (ICCs) to facilitate redressal of grievances in case any women employee faces harassment at workplace. She also disseminated some important tips and useful information to the participants regarding how to prohibit and prevent sexual harassment at workplace.



### Inquiry Conducted by OSCW on Cases Assigned by Hon'ble High Court of Orissa:

Hon'ble High Court of Odisha has recognised the Standard Procedure of Inquiry adopted by the Commission on violation of rights of women and has passed orders in the case of Sambara Sabar Vs. State of Odisha, vide WPC No.11860 of 2015 where the inquiry was conducted by the Commission. Accordingly, the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa has referred another 27 cases to the office of the Odisha State Commission for Women with a direction to conduct inquiry and recommend for payment of compensation in maternal death case due to medical negligence.

During the financial year 2023-24, the Odisha State Commission for women has conducted inquiry in respect of the following six number of cases and recommended compensations for payment by the Government.
